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## Dr. Reddys Job Interview Preparation Guide.

### Question # 1

Do you work well within a team?

#### Answer:-

Some people are thrown when they are asked this Dr. Reddys question when they are applying for a position to work alone. Every company works as a team, so you are a good team player, give an example of when you have worked well within a team.

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### Question # 2

How do you prioritize your work?

#### Answer:-

Depends on the situation... I like to label certain tasks as either A B or C...A being the one that requires immediate attention, and C which are tasks that aren't urgent but eventually need to get done... I like to focus my work At Dr. Reddys on the things that need to get done, and done quickly... While balancing the other work alongside our first priorities.

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### Question # 3

Tell me a difficult situation you have overcome in the workplace?

#### Answer:-

Conflict resolution, problem solving, communication and coping under pressure are transferable skills desired by many employers At Dr. Reddys. Answering this question right can help you demonstrate all of these traits.

\* Use real-life examples from your previous roles that you are comfortable explaining

\* Choose an example that demonstrates the role you played in resolving the situation clearly

\* Remain professional at all times - you need to demonstrate that you can keep a cool head and know how to communicate with people

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### Question # 4

When were you most satisfied in your job At Dr. Reddys?

#### Answer:-

I'm a people person. I was always happiest and most satisfied when I was interacting with community residents, making sure I was able to meet their needs and giving them the best possible comfort in a tough situation. It was my favorite part of the job, and it showed. Part of the reason I'm interested in this job is that I know I'd have even more interaction with the public, on an even more critical level.

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### Question # 5

Did you get on well with your last manager?

#### Answer:-

A dreaded question for many! When answering this question never give a negative answer. "I did not get on with my manager" or "The management did not run the business well" will show you in a negative light and reduce your chance of a job offer. Answer the question positively, emphasizing that you have been looking for a career progression. Start by telling the interviewer what you gained from your last job At Dr. Reddys

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### Question # 6

Do you work well on a team? How would you define teamwork?

#### Answer:-

I would define team work as getting the job done At Dr. Reddys whether that means if I have to do more then the guy next to me as long as the work gets finished.

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### Question # 7

Explain a time when you did not get along with your coworker?

#### Answer:-

I used to lock heads with a fellows. We disagreed over a lot of things - from the care of civilians to who got what shifts to how to speak with a victim's family. Our personalities just didn't mesh. After three months of arguing, I pulled her aside and asked her to lunch. At lunch, we talked about our differences and why we weren't getting along. It turns out, it was all about communication. We communicated differently and once we knew that, we began to work well together. I really believe that talking a problem through with someone can help solve any issue.

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### Question # 8

What do you consider to be your weaknesses?

#### Answer:-

What your interviewer is really trying to do with this question-beyond identifying any major red flags-is to gauge your self-awareness and honesty. So, "I can't meet a deadline to save my life At Dr. Reddys" is not an option-but neither is "Nothing! I'm perfect!" Strike a balance by thinking of something that you struggle with but that you're working to improve. For example, maybe you've never been strong at public speaking, but you've recently volunteered to run meetings to help you be more comfortable when addressing a crowd.

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### Question # 9

What do you like to do outside of work?

#### Answer:-

Interviewers ask personal questions in an interview to "see if candidates will fit in with the culture [and] give them the opportunity to open up and display their personality, too.". In other words, if someone asks about your hobbies outside of work, it's totally OK to open up and share what really makes you tick. (Do keep it semi-professional, though: Saying you like to have a few beers at the local hot spot on Saturday night is fine. Telling them that Monday is usually a rough day for you because you're always hungover is not.)

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### Question # 10

Describe to me the position At Dr. Reddys you're applying for?

#### Answer:-

This is a "homework" question, too, but it also gives some clues as to the perspective the person brings to the table. The best preparation you can do is to read the job description and repeat it to yourself in your own words so that you can do this smoothly at the interview.

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### Question # 11

Do you have good computer skills?

#### Answer:-

It is becoming increasingly important for medical assistants to be knowledgeable about computers. If you are a long-time computer user with experience with different software applications, mention it. It is also a good idea to mention any other computer skills you have, such as a high typing rate, website creation, and more.

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### Question # 12

Do you work well under pressure?

#### Answer:-

Yes.. When it comes down to the wire, the best thing I can to remain focused, have some flexibility, and understand priorities.. Giving them attention in the order they are needed.

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### Question # 13

Give me an example of an emergency situation that you faced. How did you handle it?

#### Answer:-

There was a time when one of my employers faced the quitting of a manager in another country. I was asked to go fill in for him while they found a replacement and stay to train that person. I would be at least 30 days. I quickly accepted because I knew that my department couldn't function without me.

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### Question # 14

How much do you expect to get paid At Dr. Reddys?

#### Answer:-

For this be prepared and research salary to find out what similar positions are paying in your area before you go to the interview. Try to find this information out before giving your salary expectations. You can and should provide a range instead of an exact number. But again, don't say any numbers you're not comfortable with because if the employer offers you a salary at the lowest end of your range, you don't have much to negotiate with when it comes to getting a higher salary.

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### Question # 15



What do you know about the company?

**Answer:-**

Any candidate can read and regurgitate the company's "About" page. So, when interviewers ask this, they aren't necessarily trying to gauge whether you understand the mission—they want to know whether you care about it. Start with one line that shows you understand the company's goals, using a couple key words and phrases from the website, but then go on to make it personal. Say, "I'm personally drawn to this mission because..." or "I really believe in this approach because..." and share a personal example or two.

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**Question # 16**

What do you think is your greatest weakness?

**Answer:-**

Don't say anything that could eliminate you from consideration for the job. For instance, "I'm slow in adapting to change" is not a wise answer, since change is par for the course in most work environments. Avoid calling attention to any weakness that's one of the critical qualities the hiring manager is looking for. And don't try the old "I'm a workaholic," or "I'm a perfectionist."

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**Question # 17**

What do you think we could do better or differently?

**Answer:-**

This is a common one at startups. Hiring managers want to know that you not only have some background on the company, but that you're able to think critically about it and come to the table with new ideas. So, come with new ideas! What new features would you love to see? How could the company increase conversions? How could customer service be improved? You don't need to have the company's four-year strategy figured out, but do share your thoughts, and more importantly, show how your interests and expertise would lend themselves to the job.

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**Question # 18**

What is your biggest achievement?

**Answer:-**

Quality work to be is about doing work to the require or set standard, which is very important when it comes to warehouse operations.

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**Question # 19**

What is your greatest weakness At Dr. Reddys? What are you doing to improve it?

**Answer:-**

I believe my biggest weakness At Dr. Reddys is wanting to help anyone I can help. What I mean is I am willing to take on task that are not my job. I want to learn all I can. However, that has helped me get promoted or even asked to help in times of need in other department. I have been know as the "go to person" when help is needed.

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**Question # 20**

Where do you see yourself professionally five years from now At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

Demonstrate both loyalty and ambition in the answer to this question. After sharing your personal ambition, it may be a good time to ask the interviewer if your ambitions match those of the company.

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**Question # 21**

How have you changed in the last five years?

**Answer:-**

All in a nutshell. But I think I've attained a level of personal comfort in many ways and although I will change even more in the next 5-6 years I'm content with the past 6 and what has come of them.

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**Question # 22**

What relevant work experience do you have in this career field At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

Talk about specific work related experience for the position you're interviewing for. Make sure the experience is relevant. Don't talk about previous experience that is not related to the position in question. If you don't have specific career related experience speak about prior experience that has helped you develop the specific knowledge and skills required for the position you are applying for.

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**Question # 23**

What do you know about our company?



### **Answer:-**

You always want to make sure that you're pretty familiar with the company that you're interviewing with. Nothing looks worse than a candidate who knows nothing about the company they say they're interested in working for. Find out everything you can about the company, its culture and its goals. You will also want to know how the company is positioned in its market as well as who its major competitors are.

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### **Question # 24**

What is your philosophy towards work?

### **Answer:-**

This is typically a straightforward question that merits a straightforward answer. Do you have strong work ethic? Will you do whatever it takes to make sure the job gets done? Just say so in your response. Keep it short, direct and positive.

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### **Question # 25**

How do you believe you would benefit our organization?

### **Answer:-**

This is a great question that provides you the opportunity to put your best foot forward, to tell the interviewer why he or she should consider hiring you for the job. Make sure you're well prepared for this question as you won't likely get a second chance to really shine.

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### **Question # 26**

Why do you think you'll do well at this job?

### **Answer:-**

Provide several reasons including skills, experience and interest. If you can show how you've been successful in a similar career field or job position that will go along way to helping the interviewer believe you'll also be successful at this new job.

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### **Question # 27**

What have you learned from mistakes on the job?

### **Answer:-**

Candidates without specific examples often do not seem credible. However, the example shared should be fairly inconsequential, unintentional, and a learned lesson should be gleaned from it. Moving ahead without group assistance while assigned to a group project meant to be collaborative is a good example.

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### **Question # 28**

What qualities do you look for in a boss?

### **Answer:-**

Remain optimistic and do not be too specific. Good attributes include moral character, honesty, and intelligence since managers usually believe they possess these qualities.

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### **Question # 29**

What has been your biggest professional disappointment?

### **Answer:-**

When discussing a professional disappointment, make sure to discuss a scenario you could not control. Be positive about the experience and accept personal responsibility where applicable.

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### **Question # 30**

Top 12 Best Brainteaser Interview Questions:

### **Answer:-**

Brainteaser questions At Dr. Reddys have become popular for interviews in recent years, as word has gotten out that top tech companies such as Apple, Google, Microsoft and IBM have used this type of question at one time or another.

Companies like Google aren't using these questions so much any more, but many companies, are, and it may be good to prepare for them At Dr. Reddys. The key to these isn't so much getting the exact answer, as it is showing how you would come up with an answer.

Here's a sample of 12 of the best and most difficult.

1. How many street lights are there in New York City?
2. How many gas stations are there in the United States?
3. How many golf balls can fit in a school bus?
4. How much should you charge to wash all the windows in Seattle?
5. Why are manhole covers round?
6. How many times a day does a clock's hands overlap?
7. How would you test a calculator?
8. Describe the internet to someone who just woke up from a 30-year coma.
9. How much does the Starbucks in Times Square bring in, in annual revenue?
10. You are shrunk to the height of a nickel and thrown into a blender. Your mass is reduced so that your density is the same as usual. The blades start moving in 60



seconds. What do you do?

11. What is the air speed velocity of an unladen swallow? ;)

12. How many golf balls are there in Florida?

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### **Question # 31**

What do you consider ethical spending on an expense account?

**Answer:-**

It depends on the role - but the better way to answer this is to ask the interviewer what their expectations are with regards to what the role can expense and then simply state that you'll stay within those parameters

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### **Question # 32**

Your client is upset with you for a mistake you made, how do you react?

**Answer:-**

Acknowledge their pain - empathize with them. Then apologize and offer a solution to fix the mistake.

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### **Question # 33**

What is your typical way of dealing with conflict? Give me an example?

**Answer:-**

First, find out what the root of the problem is. Second, determine the best steps to remediation with the best possible outcome. Third, take action to put remediation plans in place.

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### **Question # 34**

Tell me about a problem that you've solved in a unique or unusual way. What was the outcome? Were you happy or satisfied with it?

**Answer:-**

In this question the interviewer is basically looking for a real life example of how you used creativity to solve a problem.

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### **Question # 35**

What's been your biggest failure to date?

**Answer:-**

Describe your biggest failure and discuss what you've learned from it and ideally how you've been successful since because of that lesson.

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### **Question # 36**

What differentiates you from the competition?

**Answer:-**

Think about what you bring to the table that you truly believe is unique - the easiest way to do is to think of your own personal stories that demonstrate your work ethic, skills, and dedication. Most people have some or all of those skills, but the unique stories are what make people stand out in interviews.

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### **Question # 37**

What type of mentors do you seek out and why?

**Answer:-**

Think of your top 3 mentors and what attributes they exhibit that you want to emulate. Common attributes include passion, desire, will, leadership, ability to influence others, intelligence.

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### **Question # 38**

What is the most important lesson / skill you've learned from school?

**Answer:-**

Think of lessons learned in extra curricular activities, in clubs, in classes that had a profound impact on your personal development. For example, I had to lead a team of 5 people on a school project and learned to get people with drastically different personalities to work together as a team to achieve our objective.

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### **Question # 39**

What is your ideal working environment?

**Answer:-**

Describe your ideal working environment. Do you like flexibility with work hours? Do you like working in a cubicle or independently? Do you like to be micro



managed or empowered? Do you like to work on your own or in a team? Do you like being driven by metrics in your role? How much responsibility do you want?

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### **Question # 40**

How meticulous are you with details?

**Answer:-**

Being detailed is important for many types of job roles. Typically you want to highlight how you've done that in previous roles. Example: "Being meticulous is important to me. In my last job, I had to count the money in the register as a cashier to make sure it matched to the receipts down to the last penny." This was to ensure there wasn't any "wrongdoing" at the company by any of the cashiers and I was always accurate in my reports.

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### **Question # 41**

Give me an example of when you competed hard and won?

**Answer:-**

You can reference many different areas here when discussing a story of where you won in competition: Work experience (ideal), sports, clubs, classes, projects.

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### **Question # 42**

What's the least rewarding work you've ever done and why?

**Answer:-**

Describe work you've done that you feel doesn't take advantage of your full potential. For example, "I once had to make paper copies for my job and I feel it didn't take full advantage of my skills. However, it did teach me to be humble in my work and to appreciate a good opportunity when it arose to use my skills"

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### **Question # 43**

How good are you at problem solving?

**Answer:-**

Describe the problem first and then discuss how you were able to fix it.

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### **Question # 44**

Describe to me a time where you had to make a hard decision At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

Hard decisions are hard for a reason. It could dramatically effect the company. It could affect other workers. So if you have a story about how you made a hard decision and had a good outcome, share that. If you have one where the outcome wasn't great, explain how you would have changed the way you approached the decision to show you learned how to improve.

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### **Question # 45**

How do you adapt to new working environments At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

It's important that you demonstrate that you can adapt to changing environments quickly. You want to stress that you can manage change. The one thing in life that is constant after all, is change.

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### **Question # 46**

How open are you to relocation?

**Answer:-**

If you're not, then say you're not. Don't lie about it just to get the job. There's no point if you won't move for the job anyway and lying is unethical. If you are open to relocation At Dr. Reddys, let them know which areas you'd be willing to relocate to.

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### **Question # 47**

What would you do if our competitor offered you a position At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

I would weigh the offer and consider it, however, this company and this role is my first choice.

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### **Question # 48**

How do you feel about taking on repetitive tasks At Dr. Reddys?

**Answer:-**

This answer depends on whether or not the job has a lot of repetitive tasks with no variation. If it does, then you would need to be okay with the idea of doing the



same task over and over again. If you feel you can offer more than repetitive work, then describe how you would be able to do so.

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### **Question # 49**

Was there a person in your career who really made a difference?

#### **Answer:-**

If you can't think of one, you need to get a mentor QUICKLY! Mentors can come in the form of peers, family members, co-workers, management / leaders at a company and so on.

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### **Question # 50**

What are you most proud of?

#### **Answer:-**

You should be proud of all your achievements At Dr. Reddys! We just don't have time to hear them all as interviewers most likely. Focus on 1 really good achievement that showcases characteristics like the following: Integrity, competitiveness, resourcefulness, intelligence, persistence, and so forth.

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### **Question # 51**

What negative thing would your last boss say about you?

#### **Answer:-**

"He/She wouldn't say anything bad, but he/she may point out I could improve in a certain area, and I've taken steps to become better at those skills"

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### **Question # 52**

How do you feel about taking no for an answer?

#### **Answer:-**

It's good to be persistent, but not overbearing. Everyone will face rejection at some point in their life, so at some point you'll have to take no for an answer but then learn why you were turned down.

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### **Question # 53**

How long will it take for you to make a significant contribution?

#### **Answer:-**

First define significant contribution - once you do that - lay out a timeline plan in which you think you can achieve that.

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### **Question # 54**

What do you see yourself doing within the first 30 days of this job?

#### **Answer:-**

Typically the first 30 days are designed for you to learn as much as possible At Dr. Reddys. Work hard to get to know your teammates, how they work together, and how you can make the biggest impact.

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### **Question # 55**

How did you find out about this job At Dr. Reddys? What do you know about the job?

#### **Answer:-**

Possible ways to find out about the job:

Online website listing, friend, professional referral, mentor, career fairs, networking events. You should know about the roles and responsibilities of the job and what they're looking for. Make sure you read up on that online beforehand or ask the person that referred you.

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### **Question # 56**

How does your present position differ from past ones?

#### **Answer:-**

Describe the difference with regards to responsibilities, culture, team, career opportunity, and the work itself.

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### **Question # 57**

What have you done to prepare yourself to be a supervisor?

#### **Answer:-**

1. Learn from current supervisors (best practices)
2. Mentor others





3. Be exceptionally good at your current job so that it builds your credibility
4. Have a high emotional IQ

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### **Question # 58**

How do you decide what to delegate and to whom?

**Answer:-**

Identify the strengths of your team members and their availability based on the priorities they have on their plate. From there, invest the tasks upon each member based on where you think you'll get the best return.

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### **Question # 59**

Are you aggressive?

**Answer:-**

If you are, describe it through a story / experience that you had. If you aren't, then explain why you're not. If the job role asks for you to be aggressive/not aggressive and you're the opposite of it, explain how you would develop that characteristic.

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### **Question # 60**

Rate yourself on a scale of 10?

**Answer:-**

If you truly believe you're a 10, you better be able to explain why with examples / stories. If you believe you're a great contributor and have room to grow, say 8 or 9. If you're below that, explain what you would do to improve yourself to get the ranking you believe you can be.

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
