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# Helper Pipefitter Job Interview Preparation Guide.

# Question #1

How do you think you might fit this position As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer:-

An important part of research before the interview is what the company does and how the job role relates to that. This includes the company philosophy and working methods. Questions such as this seek to find out how a candidate will fit into the organisation As Helper Pipefitter. Answer positively; including practical examples of how you anticipate you would perform in the new role.

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### Question # 2

How would your boss and co-workers describe you?

### Answer-

First of all, be honest (remember, if you get this job, the hiring manager will be calling your former bosses and co-workers!). Then, try to pull out strengths and traits you haven't discussed in other aspects of the interview As Helper Pipefitter, such as your strong work ethic or your willingness to pitch in on other projects when needed.

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# Question # 3

Tell me about a time when you had to think strategically?

# Answer:

There was a time when I was told I had to get rid of 20% of my people. I had to determine which persons I needed the most by determining who could do what. I had to put aside personal feelings so that I could keep a working crew to handle he same workload with less people.

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# Question # 4

What can you offer me that another person can't?

# Answer:-

This is when you talk about your record of getting things done. Go into specifics from your resume and portfolio; show an employer your value and how you'd be an asset.

You have to say, "I'm the best person for the job As Helper Pipefitter. I know there are other candidates who could fill this position, but my passion for excellence sets me apart from the pack. I am committed to always producing the best results. For example..."

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# Question # 5

What makes you right for this position?

# Answer:-

This question can be tricky because you need to show your worth As Helper Pipefitter without sounding cocky or arrogant. Research the business ahead of time and become familiar with its mission and values. Take the time to figure out how your personal qualities fit the needs of the business and use that fit to provide your answer.

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# Question # 6

Did you get on well with your last manager?

# Answer:

A dreaded question for many! When answering this question never give a negative answer. "I did not get on with my manager" or "The management did not run the business well" will show you in a negative light and reduce your chance of a job offer. Answer the question positively, emphasizing that you have been looking for a career progression. Start by telling the interviewer what you gained from your last job As Helper Pipefitter



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### Question #7

How many basketballs would fit in this room?

### Answer:

One. You did not ask what is the maximum number of basketballs you can fit in the room.

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### Question #8

How would your former employer describe you?

# Answer:-

In all likelihood, the interviewer will actually speak with your former employer so honesty is key. Answer as confidently and positively as possible and list all of the positive things your past employer would recognize about you. Do not make the mistake of simply saying you are responsible, organized, and dependable. Instead, include traits that are directly related to your work as a medical assistant, such as the ability to handle stressful situations and difficult patients, the way you kept meticulous records, and more.

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### Question #9

What can you tell me about team work as part of the job As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer:-

There is usually a team of staff nurses working in cooperation with each other. A team of nurses has to get along well and coordinate their actions, usually by dividing their responsibilities into sectors or specific activities. They help each other perform tasks requiring more than one person.

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### Question # 10

What do you already know about our company?

### Answer-

Good reputation of a large home grown company that has various departments and product.

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# Question # 11

What do you consider to be your weaknesses?

# Answer:-

What your interviewer is really trying to do with this question-beyond identifying any major red flags-is to gauge your self-awareness and honesty. So, "I can't meet a deadline to save my life As Helper Pipefitter" is not an option-but neither is "Nothing! I'm perfect!" Strike a balance by thinking of something that you struggle with but that you're working to improve. For example, maybe you've never been strong at public speaking, but you've recently volunteered to run meetings to help you be more comfortable when addressing a crowd.

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# Question # 12

What do you like to do outside of work?

# Answer:-

Interviewers ask personal questions in an interview to "see if candidates will fit in with the culture [and] give them the opportunity to open up and display their personality, too,". In other words, if someone asks about your hobbies outside of work, it's totally OK to open up and share what really makes you tick. (Do keep it semi-professional, though: Saying you like to have a few beers at the local hot spot on Saturday night is fine. Telling them that Monday is usually a rough day for you because you're always hungover is not.)

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# Question # 13

What motivates you to succeed?

# Answer:-

Your interviewer will likely want to know the reasons why you will remain motivated to do your best during your employment with the company As Helper Pipefitter. Perhaps you are interested in being challenged, but you may also have interest in being recognized for your hard work in the form of the number of sales you can attain. A great example answer for this question is "I always do my best in everything, including my job. I take pride in my success, and I also want the company for which I work to be successful. Being affiliated with a company that is known for its excellence is very important to me."

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# Question # 14

Why do you feel you will excel at rhis job?

# Answer:

This question presents an excellent opportunity for you to discuss your education, qualifications and personal traits. You might say something like "I studied property management as well as behavior during my college years and I have two years' experience in real estate.

I can gauge the homes or apartments in which clients will be interested based solely upon the needs of their families. Finally, my organizational skills will allow me to schedule appointments or showings confidently and arrive for them punctually." This shows your interviewer that you have all of the skills necessary to become



successful not only for yourself, but also for your employer.

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# Question #15

Describe a typical work week for this position As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer:

Interviewers expect a candidate for employment to discuss what they do while they are working in detail. Before you answer, consider the position As Helper Pipefitter you are applying for and how your current or past positions relate to it. The more you can connect your past experience with the job opening, the more successful you will be at answering the questions.

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### Question # 16

Describe to me the position As Helper Pipefitter you're applying for?

### Answer:-

This is a "homework" question, too, but it also gives some clues as to the perspective the person brings to the table. The best preparation you can do is to read the job description and repeat it to yourself in your own words so that you can do this smoothly at the interview.

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### Question # 17

Explain me about your experience working in this field As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer-

I am dedicated, hardworking and great team player for the common goal of the company I work with. I am fast learner and quickly adopt to fast pace and dynamic area. I am well organized, detail oriented and punctual person.

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### Question # 18

Give me an example of an emergency situation that you faced. How did you handle it?

### Answer:-

There was a time when one of my employers faced the quitting of a manager in another country. I was asked to go fill in for him while they found a replacement and stay to train that person. I would be at least 30 days. I quickly accepted because I knew that my department couldn't function without me.

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# Question # 19

How do you handle stressful situations?

# Answer:

By remaining calm, weighing out all my options and executing a plan to get the situation resolve.

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# Question # 20

How many square feet of pizza are eaten in the United States each month?

# Answer:-

This is a classic guesstimate question where you need to think aloud. And so first off you round the U.S. population to 300 million people (it's actually about 315 million but rounding will be much easier and your interviewer will not score you lower for rounding). Then estimate how many people eat pizza. A decent educated guess is two out of every three people, or 200 million. Now let's say the average pizza-eating person eats pizza twice a month, and eats two slices at a time. That's four slices a month. If the average slice of pizza is perhaps six inches at the base and 10 inches long, then the slice is 30 square inches of pizza. So, four pizza slices would be 120 square inches (30 times 4).

Since one square foot equals 144 square inches (12 times 12), let's assume that each person who eats pizza eats one square foot per month. Since there are 200 million pizza-eating Americans, 200 million square feet of pizza are consumed in the U.S. each month. To summarize: 300 million people in America, 200 million eat pizza, average slice of pizza is six inches at the base and 10 inches long or 30 square inches, average American eats four slices of pizza a month, four pieces times 30 square inches equals 120 square inches (one square foot is 144 square inches), so let's assume one square foot per person, and thus one square foot times 200 million people equals 200 million square feet of pizza a month.

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# Question # 21

How much do you expect to get paid As Helper Pipefitter?

# Answer.

For this be prepared and research salary to find out what similar positions are paying in your area before you go to the interview. Try to find this information out before giving your salary expectations. You can and should provide a range instead of an exact number. But again, don't say any numbers you're not comfortable with because if the employer offers you a salary at the lowest end of your range, you don't have much to negotiate with when it comes to getting a higher salary.

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# Question # 22

How would you observe the level of motivation of your subordinates?

Answer:-



Choosing the right metrics and comparing productivity of everyone on daily basis is a good answer, doesn't matter in which company you apply for a supervisory role

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# Question # 23

What do you know about the company?

### Answer:

Any candidate can read and regurgitate the company's "About" page. So, when interviewers ask this, they aren't necessarily trying to gauge whether you understand the mission-they want to know whether you care about it. Start with one line that shows you understand the company's goals, using a couple key words and phrases from the website, but then go on to make it personal. Say, "I'm personally drawn to this mission because..." or "I really believe in this approach because..." and share a personal example or two.

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# Question # 24

What schedule do you hope to work? Are you willing to work extra hours?

### Answer:-

Be honest. If you really want the job and are willing to work any schedule needed, say so. If, however, you have no intention of working late hours or weekends, simply let the interviewer know the hours that you are available to work. The same applies to extra hours. You are more likely to be hired if you are willing to work any time you are needed. However, saying that you are willing and then complaining about the hours once you start working is a recipe for disaster.

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### Question # 25

What type of work environment do you prefer?

### Answer:

Ideally one that's similar to the environment of the company you're applying to. Be specific.

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# Question # 26

How do you evaluate your ability to handle conflict?

### Answer:-

I pride myself on being a good problem solver. Through my previous job and management positions I have faced numerous conflicts in different situations, and my experiences have helped me to hone my issue resolution skills. I believe that it is important to get to and address the root of the issue, in a respectable manner.

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# Question # 27

How do you think I rate as an interviewer?

# Answer:-

I think you did fine. I'm sure you've conducted a lot of interviews, and it's probably second nature for you now. Thanks for taking the time to meet with me today. I'm sure you have a lot of things you have to juggle every day.

I'd say you rate at least ten out of ten. The questions you asked seemed spot on. I can tell you guys are working hard to find the perfect applicant for the job. I'm glad I could meet with you.

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# Question # 28

What's your salary history?

# Answer:

When you are interviewing for a new job, it is common practice for the company to ask you about your salary history. I typically want to know what the candidate's base salary is, if they receive any bonus, the average bonus amount, and any additional compensation or perks, such as 500k matching, stock grants or stock options, paid time off and how much they are required to pay towards their medical premiums.

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# Question # 29

Tell me about a time when you had to give someone difficult feedback As Helper Pipefitter?

# Answer:

By asking this question, your interviewer hopes to learn whether you can communicate effectively, address issues in the workplace and motivate others during difficult times. Giving negative feedback requires honesty, thoughtfulness and tact. Answering this question well can help show an interviewer that you would be a good fit for a managerial position or a position that involves working closely with others.

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# Question # 30

Do you know anyone that works with our company?

# Answer:

Sometimes companies have policies relating to the hiring of individuals related to current company employees. If you are related to anyone working for the company make sure you're aware of company policies before you enter the interview. If you have a friend or acquaintance working for the company make sure have good



relationship with this individual before mentioning them.

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# Question #31

What do you consider to be your greatest strength?

### Answer:-

There isn't any right answer. Just make sure to make your response positive and true. A few good examples include: Your ability to solve complex problems, Your ability to work well on a team, Your ability to shine under pressure, Your ability to focus in chaotic situations, Your ability to prioritize and organize, Your ability to cut through the fluff to identify the real issues, Your ability to influence other positively. If your strength relates to the position in question that will be more beneficial - but again be honest, don't create a strength for yourself just because you think it will sound good.

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# Question #32

What has disappointed you about a previous job?

### Answer:-

Again, this question could get you in trouble so tread carefully. Some good answers might be that your previous job didn't provide any room for growth, that you were laid off due to a mandatory reduction in staff, that they closed their office in your state and required you to relocate, etc. Make sure not to mention anything negative about the people you worked with, the company in general or the job itself.

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### Question # 33

How do you measure success?

### Answer:-

There may be several good answers. Some include: you're able to set realistic, yet aggressive goals that push you and you're able to achieve them, you go the extra mile on all projects, client satisfaction is high, your boss is elated at your performance on all projects, etc.

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# Question #34

If you were hiring a person for this job As Helper Pipefitter, what would you look for?

### Answer:

Discuss qualities you possess required to successfully complete the job duties.

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# Question #35

How do you propose to compensate for your lack of experience?

# Answer:

The first thing you should do is discuss experience you have the interviewer is unfamiliar with. Once that is detailed, tell the person conducting the interview that you are able to learn new tasks and information in a reasonable period of time and possess a strong work ethic. However, only state this if you can live up to these expectations.

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# Question #36

What position do you prefer on a team working on a project?

# Answer:-

Do not claim to be comfortable with a specific role if you in are in fact not comfortable with it. However, if you have no problem working in certain roles or situations, be sure to discuss this with the interviewer.

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# Question # 37

Tell me about the most fun you have had on the job?

# Answer:-

When answering this question, discuss situations where you completed tasks benefitting your previous employers.

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# Question # 38

Why do you want to leave your current company As Helper Pipefitter?

# Answer:

Bad Answer: Complaining about or blaming their former job, boss or colleagues. Also, having no good reason.

Good answer: One that focuses on the positives about why the job they're applying for offers them better learning or career opportunities, chances for advancement, aligns more closely to their long term goals, or is a better fit for them.

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# Question # 39



How much are you willing to sacrifice to be successful at work As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer:

With anything comes sacrifice. The questions is how much of it are you willing to sacrifice with regards to work life balance, stress, etc?

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### Question # 40

If you were given more initiatives than you could handle, what would you do?

### Answer-

First prioritize the important activities that impact the business most. Then discuss the issue of having too many initiatives with the boss so that it can be offloaded. Work harder to get the initiatives done.

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# Question # 41

Your coworker highlights your mistakes in front of everyone, how do you handle the situation?

### Answer:

Admit to the mistake without being emotional, but then discuss how you are being proactive in getting it fixed. Lastly, pull the co-worker aside later on to tell them that you'd appreciate it if they gave you the feedback 1:1 first before throwing you under the bus.

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### Question # 42

What is your typical way of dealing with conflict? Give me an example?

### Answer:-

First, find out what the root of the problem is. Second, determine the best steps to remediation with the best possible outcome. Third, take action to put remediation plans in place.

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# Question # 43

Describe a time when you put your needs aside to help a co-worker understand a task. How did you assist them? What was the result?

### Answer:

The key is to show that the mentoring of a co-worker was first a higher priority than the task you had at hand (remember, you want to show that you focus on highest priority tasks first). Then, describe in detail how you helped them not only complete the task but learn to do it on their own. You want to teach them HOW to fish and not to simply fish for them.

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# Question # 44

What are your lifelong dreams?

# Answer:-

If your dreams don't relate to the job closely, make sure you highlight aspects of the job that will help develop the skills that will help you with your dreams. Ideally, you want your dreams to relate strongly to the career path you're interviewing for though.

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# Question # 45

How do you stay up to date with industry?

# Answer:-

Discuss how you stay up to date by reading industry specific sites, magazines, and Google / yahoo news. Also make sure you stay up to date by reading the current news on the company's website.

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# Question # 46

How do you feel about this company's vision?

# Answer:-

First find out where the company envisions itself in 3-5 years. If you can't find the vision of the company, that's probably a big question mark on the company itself. Once you do, identify how those company's visions align to your personal values and goals and then articulate how tightly correlated that is to the interviewer. For example - this company wants to be the #1 provider of green technology in the world and I feel strongly about that vision because we've got a chance to collectively impact the world to become a greener society and save our clients at the same time!

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# Question # 47

What does "collaboration with teammates" mean to you?

# Answer:-

Drinking at the water cooler together is not the best example. Think of how you can collaborate with teammates to generate new ideas, to create initiatives to impact the business' success for the better (specifically in the department that you're applying for). For example, if you're applying to marketing, collaboration could mean discussing new ways of social media advertising to reach an audience of over a million people to strengthen the brand awareness of the company.



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### Question # 48

What types of situations do you consider "unfixable"?

### Answer:-

Most situations are "fixable" - the ones that are not are typically related to business ethics (someone is cheating the company, someone is stealing, etc)

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### Question # 49

How do you feel about giving back to the community?

### Answer:-

Describe your charitable activities to showcase that community work is important to you. If you haven't done one yet, go to www.globalguideline.com - charitable work is a great way to learn about other people and it's an important part of society - GET INVOLVED!

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# Question # 50

What do you know about our competition?

### Answer:-

Make sure you do your research on their competitors. You can find this by going to yahoo finance and click on their competitors (if they are public). From there research the news on them and go to their websites to understand their positioning on solutions and vision. You can also research local regional companies that are their competition (if it's a smaller private company on a regional scale) by simply typing in similar product offerings in the Google search followed by the city. Make sure you know their competitor's vision, products, culture, and how they are differentiated against their competition (and if they're not, how they could be)

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# Question # 51

Have you ever mentored anyone before? If yes, describe the situation?

### Answer-

Describe a time where you've helped someone else. Mentor ships can be informal so as you've helped someone over a period of time that can certainly count. The key is to highlight how you utilized certain skills/attributes like coaching, teaching, patience, communication skills, and so forth to mentor that person.

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# Question # 52

What's the least rewarding work you've ever done and why?

# Answer:-

Describe work you've done that you feel doesn't take advantage of your full potential. For example, "I once had to make paper copies for my job and I feel it didn't take full advantage of my skills. However, it did teach me to be humble in my work and to appreciate a good opportunity when it arose to use my skills"

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# Question # 53

How good are you at problem solving?

# Answer:-

Describe the problem first and then discuss how you were able to fix it.

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# Question # 54

How well do you multi-task?

# Answer:-

Multi-tasking is an important part of most jobs. You want to show that you're good at it but not overwhelmed with it. So discuss just a few things you can multi-task well on - for example: "I'm good at multi tasking between work email and working on projects As Helper Pipefitter and the reason it because I'm good at prioritizing my work emails.

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# Question # 55

If I talked to your three biggest fans, who would they be and why?

# Answer:-

If you can reference three professionals with executive titles (CXO, VP, Director, Manager), that carries a lot of weight. Make sure you highlight how you've helped them achieve their biggest objectives and how that's made them your fan.

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# Question # 56

What have you done to improve yourself in the last year As Helper Pipefitter?

# Answer:-



Discuss how you've improved yourself through work experiences, books you've read, classes, club(s) / extracurricular activities and describe the process on how it's happened. For example: I've improved my presentation skills tremendously because I've had to do 2 presentations this year for my communications class.

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# Question # 57

What would you do if our competitor offered you a position As Helper Pipefitter?

### Answer:-

I would weigh the offer and consider it, however, this company and this role is my first choice.

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# Question # 58

Describe a time when you've been overwhelmed with work?

### Answer.

Show how you were able to over the "overwhelmed" feeling - by delegating tasks, getting people on your team to help you out, or by prioritizing your work and focusing on the most important issues first As Helper Pipefitter.

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### Question # 59

What do you look for in terms of culture -- structured or entrepreneurial?

### Answer:-

A good answer is to discuss the importance of having both elements in a company As Helper Pipefitter. Structure is good to maintain a focus on priorities and making sure people are productive but having an entrepreneurial spirit can help cultivate new ideas that can truly help the company.

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### Question # 60

What negative thing would your last boss say about you?

# Answer:-

"He/She wouldn't say anything bad, but he/she may point out I could improve in a certain area, and I've taken steps to become better at those skills"

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# Question # 61

What is your greatest achievement outside of work As Helper Pipefitter?

# Answer:

This is a great opportunity for you to discuss how you've given back to the community, how you've achieved in a competitive extracurricular activity (think sports or clubs), how you've mentored others, and so forth.

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# Question # 62

Do you think a leader should be feared or liked?

# Answer:-

Liked. You want to work harder for people that inspire and motivate you. Fear only lasts for so long.

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# Question # 63

There's no right or wrong answer, but if you could be anywhere in the world right now, where would you be?

# Answer:-

Just be honest about where you'd like to be - you never know - you may end up bonding with the interviewer with the location. However, you want to stress that you want to work out of the location that you're interviewing for.

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# Question # 64

How did you find out about this job As Helper Pipefitter? What do you know about the job?

# Answer:-

Possible ways to find out about the job:

Online website listing, friend, professional referral, mentor, career fairs, networking events. You should know about the roles and responsibilities of the job and what they're looking for. Make sure you read up on that online beforehand or ask the person that referred you.

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# Question # 65

Does your boss know you're here today?

# Answer:-

Usually, you probably haven't told your boss for obvious reasons. So it's ok to say that they do not. You don't want to upset the balance at your current job after all



and nothing is guaranteed in an interview. The interviewer should understand this stance.

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# Question #66

What does "thinking outside the box" mean to you?

### Answer:-

It means not doing things exactly the same way as everyone else. You've got to challenge the status quo and bring something new to the business.

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### Question # 67

Can you perform Internet research? Please describe to me your steps in doing so?

### Answer:-

Internet research can entail Google searches, industry sites, news articles, social networks and company websites.

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# Question # 68

Are you aggressive?

### Answer:-

If you are, describe it through a story / experience that you had. If you aren't, then explain why you're not. If the job role asks for you to be aggressive/not aggressive and you're the opposite of it, explain how you would develop that characteristic.

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# Question #69

What makes you a good manager?

# Answer:-

Describe how you manage people, time, money and energy in the most effective manner to achieve the best return of that investment.

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# Question #70

What specific steps do you utilize in solving workplace problems?

# Answer:-

Analyze the problem As Helper Pipefitter. Discuss possible remedies and resulting outcomes. Decide on the remedy and track results. Re-visit problem if it's not resolved.

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# Question # 71

Who has been an inspiration for you?

# Answer:-

Cite your role models (possible examples could be your parents, people successful in the industry, world leaders, etc)

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# Question #72

Tell me about the last time you missed a goal or deadline?

# Answer:

Unless you're a completely perfect person, chances are you've messed up before on a goal/deadline. If so, discuss how you fell short and what you would have done in retrospect to achieve it.

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# Question #73

How do you ensure all of your work gets accomplished in a productive manner?

# Answer:

The key is to prioritize what's important in your work and to stay organized to accomplish the tasks. A strong work ethic also helps.

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# Question # 74

What was the biggest professional risk you have taken and what was the outcome?

# Answer:

First discuss how you weighed the pros and cons of the risk and the results you'd believe you could achieve. Then discuss the action plan you put into place for it and outline that step by step. Then discuss the outcome and if it wasn't optimal talk about what you would do differently in hindsight.
