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Veterinary Surgeon Job Interview Preparation Guide.

Question # 1

Tell me how do you determine the best treatment for an animal?

Answer:-

I love animals. They've always been my passion. I considered going into zoology, but saw there wasn't much of a calling. The medical aspect of the vet field also interests me, so it just made sense to become a tech and combine two things I'm interested in and passionate about.

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Question # 2

Tell me how will you handle euthanasia?

Answer:-

I have mostly worked with fully or partially digital X-rays, however we were taught in school how to develop from film. While I may not currently have the experience, I am very willing to learn.

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Question # 3

Why do you want to work at our clinic as Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

I had a patient get very light under anesthesia abruptly I turned up the gas gave 5 quick breaths and they were back down and then I ran the iso at a slightly higher rate to prevent it from happening again.

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Question # 4

Tell me what Are Some Rewarding Experience You've Had With Animals?

Answer:-

The intent behind this question is to determine if you appreciate animals in general, not just dogs and cats. Talk about some of your personal animal experiences, whether looking after your pet turtle when you were a child or finding an injured bird and nursing it back to health. If one particular incident or pet was responsible for your love of all animals, be sure to share that story and explain why it had such an impact on your life. Anyone can profess a love of animals, but the interviewer wants to see if you really mean it and share a connection with them.

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Question # 5

Explain me about your animal training?

Answer:-

I study Animal Care at college where we deal with animals day in and day out. Also I have 3 dogs at home and have grown up with animals around me.

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Question # 6

Tell me what appeals to you most about working as a veterinary assistant?

Answer:-

I can deal very well with blood. I have years of a experience as a veterinary assistant and I am comfortable drawing blood, preparing wounds, and assisting with surgery.

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Question # 7

Tell me how do you feel about exotic pets?



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Answer:-

I am comfortable with all animals as long as someone directs me where to safely hold animals I have little experience with.

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Question # 8

Do you know what does a Veterinary Surgeon do?

Answer:-

Most of the jobs available for Veterinary Surgeons are in a Vets general practice, much like a doctors but for animals, So they diagnose, treat and operate on animals that are injured or ill. They will generally have an animal hospital where they keep animals overnight if necessary. Types of procedures that a veterinary surgeon performs:

- * vaccinations
- * X-rays
- * consult and advise on illness and disease
- * Euthanasing injured and ill animals
- * animal neutering

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Question # 9

Tell us what qualities do Veterinary Surgeons need?

Answer:-

You must be interested in animal welfare but not over sentimental. You must be able to deduce what can be wrong with an animal just by watching them as they cannot inform you of the symptoms. A good bedside manner with animal owners is also required as well as having to make hard choices about animals sometimes to end their suffering.

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Question # 10

Tell us if a vet asked you to do something that was outside of your job description, how would you respond?

Answer:-

There was a pomeranian that was only 2 years old and just very sweet. Unfortunately, her owners left her outside often for long periods. She became injured near her hind end and since she was outside all the time the wound became infected and maggots had started to eat away at her flesh. It was so sad to see an animal in that kind of condition.

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Question # 11

Tell me an example of a time when you failed?

Answer:-

I had tried to be apart of another veterinary services office a few years ago out of highschool and they told me that I had no business trying to be apart of that just out of highschool, they didn't think my experience raising wild animals was enough.

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Question # 12

Explain me about your favorite job. What did you like most about it?

Answer:-

I was most satisfied working as a para-educator in the autism unit at Cooper High School because it was truly satisfying to help those children learn important life skills, social skills and academic skills. I remember on the last day of school, the young man in which I worked with one-on-one had received the highest grade in the class on his history final. There's nothing more satisfying than helping people or animals become better at something in which they have struggled.

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Question # 13

Explain me about your experience working in a clinic or a hospital environment?

Answer:-

What is there to say. I have owned and cared for all the animals I stated before and I can say all are different and fascinating. Many of these animals I have not had in many years but I surprise myself in the fact that I know quite a fair bit in the care and upbringing of these animals. I have been bitten by snakes and lizards, scratched and bitten by lions and tigers. I have been the first one in my family to notice anything wrong with our pets and send them to the vets asap. I have helped my brother behind the scenes of various zoos and helped care for cockatoos and joeys.

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Question # 14

Do you know whats worst about being a Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

The worst part of being a veterinary surgeon is dealing with sick animals that cannot be healed and telling their owners this.

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Question # 15

Tell me what 3 qualities in a veterinarians do you most admire? Why do you feel these qualities are important?



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Answer:-

Patience, Compassion, and Optimism I believe all three are important because in the hardest of situations, using those traits, can make a big difference in the outcome of the situation.

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Question # 16

Explain me what would you do different with your career training if you could start over again?

Answer:-

I would study every aspect a little more harder, and not be scared to jump into things and try it. Knowledge is important but you learn the most by actual experience.

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Question # 17

Explain me a specific example of a time when you had to conform to a policy with which you did not agree?

Answer:-

This past season with my synchronized swimming job, I did not agree with my oldest athlete being offered a coaching position. I felt, as her coach, that she was not ready for the responsibility. However, due to the fact that she was taking over someone else's class, she was the only one available and I was forced to accept it.

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Question # 18

Explain me how Do You Feel About Performing Duties That Aren't Part of Your Job Description?

Answer:-

The interviewer is looking for staff members who can function as a team and pitch in to help during busy times, even if the duties involved aren't in the official job description. A vet tech will often be asked to answer phones, meet clients, hand out brochures or do research online. Answer the question in such a way that shows you can take the initiative in lending a hand where it is needed and that you consider it all a part of your role.

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Question # 19

Tell me how do you respond to criticism?

Answer:-

I dog sit, train, I am certified in animal diet and nutrition. I want to expand my knowledge with some medical background.

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Question # 20

Explain me how do you handle stress?

Answer:-

I have had multiple terrifying situations. Experiences between getting trampled by horses and trying to rescue very stressed dogs. I have learned the best strategy is to keep calm. If you do not, the animal can sense it and will excite even more.

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Question # 21

Tell me whats best about being a Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

The best part of being a veterinary surgeon is curing sick and injured animals.

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Question # 22

Tell me what will you do if you are working for a vet that only allots 15 minutes for routine visits/physical exams?

Answer:-

In this instance, it seems that preparation would be the utmost importance to keep the clinic running smoothly. For example, background information about the visit would be needed to be obtained before hand by receptionists, vaccines prepared before and a quick foot would be needed!

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Question # 23

Tell me what are some goals you would like to accomplish in the next five years?

Answer:-

I am most looking forward to learning new techniques and being able to expand on my knowledge. This will provide me with the challenges of getting to know new things and being able to remember everything that I have learned.

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Question # 24

Explain me about a time when you had to go above and beyond the call of duty in order to get a job done?

Answer:-



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Very critical patient, ex-lap earlier that day with a whole bunch of weird in there. Probably cancer, we took biopsies. We went to an overnight clinic and owners didn't want to transfer, and doctor didn't want him to go home. Came in after hours to check in.

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Question # 25

Explain me a time when you anticipated a problem and took measures to prevent it?

Answer:-

Cat transfer from cage to vet office via cage... Anticipated stress on cat so I used a towel to cover cage and stayed as far away from the dogs as possible. Went slow when removing cat from cage making sure there was no stressful issues near by.

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Question # 26

Tell me how would you handle an aggressive animal?

Answer:-

I have experience, I love animals, I am fluent in two different languages and I am ready to learn anything that can be learned.

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Question # 27

Tell me how did you become interested in veterinary medicine?

Answer:-

I would find it enjoyable to assist the vet techs and other staff with unique equipment that I have never had the exposure to use/assist with previously. I would find it interesting to help animals during rehabilitation as well.

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Question # 28

Tell me what's the most difficult situation you have dealt with in your work experience?

Answer:-

I am very proud of having qualified as a veterinary nurse, and I'm also very proud of my achievements with my music.

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Question # 29

Tell me how do you handle an unhappy customer?

Answer:-

Growing up I always had cats and dogs. And when I was old enough I started helping my mom out with feeding the dogs and cats, which led to me having my own cat that I cared for and now I just help out when care for our 4 dogs, 2 cats, and our hamster.

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Question # 30

Tell me what specialized area did you focus on during your studies? Why?

Answer:-

I have had experiences dealing with animals my entire life. When I was young I had every pet imaginable, from guinea pigs to even a pony in my yard. When I was in junior high and high school I volunteered at a wildlife center rehabilitating native California wildlife and educating the public. Six years ago I decided to become involved in veterinary medicine due to my love of animals and strong interest in the medical aspect involved.

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Question # 31

Tell me how Would You Perform This Procedure?

Answer:-

Be prepared to tell how you would perform a urinalysis and dental prophylaxis, along with how you would take images and collect tissue samples. Rehearse talking about each procedure, describing it step by step in a logical manner.

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Question # 32

Tell me what is your long term career goal?

Answer:-

I am looking for a long term employment of about a year to grow professionally for vet school prep.

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Question # 33

Think of a day when you had many things to do. How did you schedule your time?

Answer:-

Not a problem at all, the busier I am the better I tend to do.



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Question # 34

Explain me about time you had a conflict with a team member. How did you handle it?

Answer:-

My family has labs and a beagle mix. The beagle mix is my problem child she has a lot of medical issues. We also have standardbreds that are retired. At school I assist in the management of the goat herd where we breed them and assist with kidding procedures.

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Question # 35

Tell me how would your co-workers describe you as Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

I have worked with everything from feral cats, to monkeys, and even lions. I have a very wide range of skills I can bring to your organization. I am looking for a starting position in an environment that will allow me to continue to grow and learn in this profession and I feel your practice will really allow me to do that.

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Question # 36

Tell me how would you handle a situation that could cause you to be late for work?

Answer:-

The most difficult experience that I faced at the Durham Humane Society was viewing how deplorable the conditions were within the small rodent room, and having the employee in charge of that room refuse to let anyone clean in there. I discovered a bug infestation amongst the food, which helped to resolve a major infestation occurring within the shelter.

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Question # 37

Tell me how do you feel about being asked to perform tasks outside of your job description?

Answer:-

In a way yes. I have uni fees to pay off and such but in my heart not so much. I just want to do it for the animals and for my own sanctification.

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Question # 38

Tell me when can a newly qualified Veterinary Surgeon start working?

Answer:-

After your 5 year degree. In your sixth and final year. You get to use everything you've learned. You will be closely supervised, but you are responsible for your own cases and have to diagnose them. Once the sixth year is completed you can apply for veterinary surgeon jobs anywhere.

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Question # 39

Tell me how Do You Think You'll Feel When We're Required to Euthanize an Animal?

Answer:-

This is a difficult part of a vet tech's job, and you can acknowledge that in your response. The interviewer is hoping that you show understanding about the need for such a process and that you will put the needs of the pet and the owners above your own discomfort or emotions. Making sure a pet is comfortable and that you are there for the owners is important.

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Question # 40

Tell me how do you feel about cleaning up after animals?

Answer:-

Yes I am. I am very curious about it but I think in the Vet field that we do research everyday just not as much as an actual researcher.

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Question # 41

Explain me about a time when you provided excellent customer service?

Answer:-

I know it won't be easy, but it's something I'm passionate about. It's not all puppies and kittens, and a lot of our patients come to see us because they're sick. I want to provide animals with compassionate care.

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Question # 42

Explain what is the biggest mistake you have made? What did you learn from it?

Answer:-

Seeing them leave the hospital after a long stay with us after a full recovery, I love seeing how happy the animal is and how relieved and thankful the owner is.



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Question # 43

Tell me what kind of animals do veterinary surgeons see?

Answer:-

Veterinary surgeons work on all kinds and sizes of different animals, from small domestic pets up to horses and bigger animals in zoos.

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Question # 44

Explain me how Would You Handle a Scared Animal?

Answer:-

A suffering animal may be aggressive and try to bite unfamiliar people who are trying to help it. Share your techniques for dealing with these situations to assure the employer that you can safely treat animals despite their fear.

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Question # 45

Tell me how do you handle stress as Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

Traveling the world and helping animals of all sorts on various continents. I was involved in a lion breeding & rehabilitation program a few years ago that aims to increase the African lion population in an impressive 4 stage program.

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Question # 46

Explain me about some of the animals you have cared for in your life?

Answer:-

I helped out with the cows on my parents farm since the time I was 12 until 2005. Then I cared for many animals at ... in my 4.5 years there, including hospitalized and boarding cats and dogs. I now volunteer with Animal Aide, where I go almost every sunday to clean cages, feed and water cats and kittens, and some times do some socializing of cats and kittens.

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Question # 47

Tell me how would you respond if asked to come in on your day off?

Answer:-

I am very hard working and I learn very fast. If I make a mistake I am quick to own up to it and fix it.

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Question # 48

Tell me how do you manage your time in the work place?

Answer:-

When working in the veterinary hospital you have to be able to prioritize your work. I will complete tasks that must be done by a vet tech and then I will delegate other tasks that can be done by another coworker so as not to fall behind schedule.

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Question # 49

Tell me why are you the best person for this position?

Answer:-

I believe that I am the best person for this position because I have 5 years experience working in an animal hospital and your hospital philosophy resembles my own in that I believe the best form of care is preventative through client education.

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Question # 50

Tell me how would your employer describe your past work?

Answer:-

Walking my dogs, cleaning out and spending time with my animals, reading, socialising with friends, go horse riding when I can and going kickboxing.

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Question # 51

Tell us how do you maintain accurate patient records?

Answer:-

I have been laid off from a job due to budget costs but I have never been asked to leave due to my work performance.

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Question # 52

Tell me what do you do when you are working with a scared animal?

Answer:-

Yes, patient care is always the top priority, but I have developed effective time management skills and I will be able to efficiently split my time between required tasks and still be successful.

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Question # 53

Tell me what are some of the animals you've worked with in the past?

Answer:-

Though it is always difficult to see an animal in pain, my purpose is to stay calm, assess the situation, and help in any way possible. In order to help you must remain composed and focused on the situation at hand.

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Question # 54

Tell me how do you respond in an emergency situation?

Answer:-

Although it is hard to see an animal in pain I know they are in the best place now and it will push me to do everything in my ability to make this animal feel more comfortable whether it be giving it fresh food and bedding or just giving it attention.

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Question # 55

Explain about the different types of animals you have worked with in the past?

Answer:-

I have been a part of multiple euthanizations and have felt emotional, but have so far kept my composure.

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Question # 56

Tell me how do you maintain accurate patient records?

Answer:-

Growing up with horses and cows, I have had to make a few split second decisions based off the reactions from an animal. I have almost been run over by large animals a few times.

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Question # 57

Why should I hire you as Veterinary Surgeon?

Answer:-

I have been bitten, but never a puncture wound. I have been bitten while in VA by the cats before while learning to restrain, but I have gotten much better at it.

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
